Head to Chibougamau, in the heart of the boreal forest, where urban life meets the great outdoors. Here, life moves at a slower pace, following the rhythm of the seasons and your desires.

Get your hiking shoes on and head out to the trails at Sentier du Bonheur trails or to Obalski Park, two ideal options for your first-ever immersion in this natural setting. The trails weave between spruce trees and waterholes, with just enough viewpoints to make everyone say "wow". On warm days, the beach at Lac Gilman becomes a family hotspot. The golf, tennis, and pickleball courts and the soccer field in the heart of the city provide a great excuse to laugh (and compete a little) with friends.

If it rains, no worries: the planetarium is sure to amaze all age groups, while the Bolarama bowling alley turns the day into a friendly tournament.

Be sure to enjoy local comfort foods, including lunch at Cabane à Midas, ice-cream treats from Pop-crèmerie or a good poutine from Stand à patates. And for a relaxing break, head for Maître Renard, where you'll savour boreal beers, mocktails or homemade lemonades, all on the terrace, with or without the kids. Folks who like to party will love Pub Royal, a lively hangout for enjoying Chibougamau's nightlife.



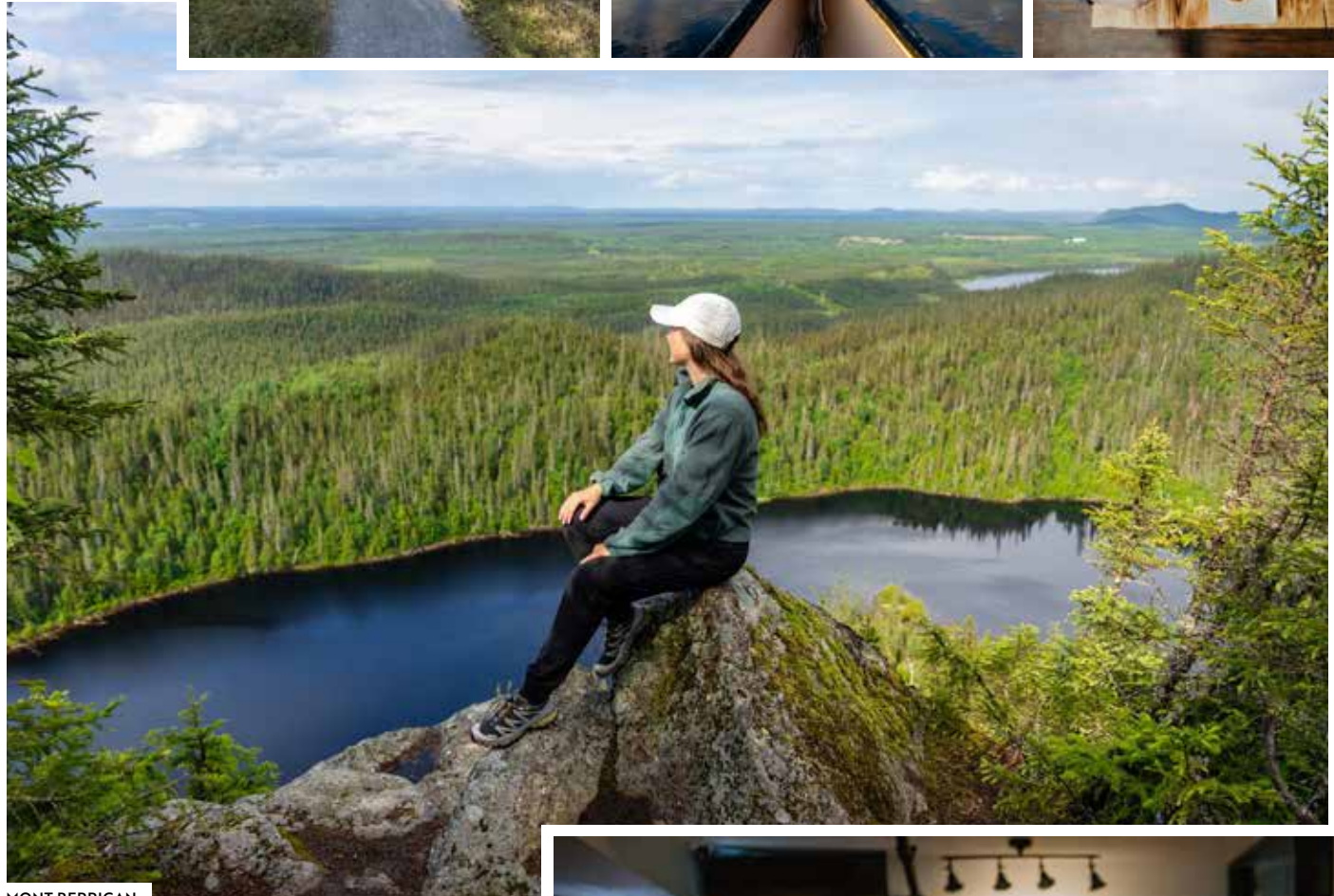

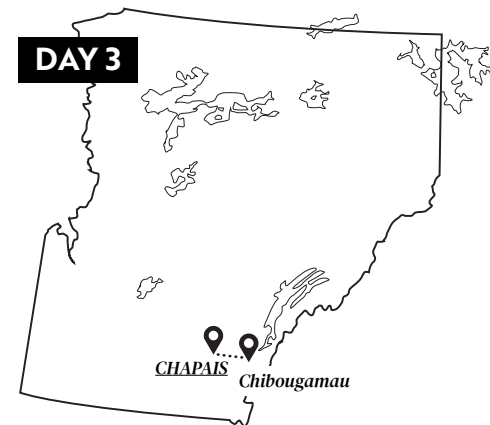

Today, it's time for artistic discoveries and forest immersion in Chapais.

First stop: Arts et Vitrail, a small workshop filled with light where Jocelyne Grondin turns glass into works of art. In these soothing surroundings featuring vibrant colours, you may find yourself taking up a new hobby.

Another way to connect with the region is through BoreA DécouVERTE, an ECONOMUSEUM® where you can explore the forest in a different way. There's no showiness here: you get to share the day-to-day experience of a person who distils essential oils for a living. The activity will engage your sense of touch and smell and prompt insights. And it's all done using an eco-friendly approach, where nothing is lost and everything is transformed.

In the afternoon, get some fresh air! With the family, the Campbell Trail offers 5 km of boardwalks and gentle forest, perfect for little feet or strollers. Mont Springer is perfect for friends. It provides more of a challenge with 3.2 km of straightforward climbing, with a clear view at the top as a reward for your efforts.

Round off the day with one of many options from Cabane du boulevard, which you can enjoy by the waters of Lac Opémiska. A perfect picnic in a relaxing setting.

LAC QUÉVILLON

The journey ends in Lebel-sur-Quévillon, a warm little town nestled on the shores of a large lake. Here, we camp, we cycle, we paddle, we relax. In short, we enjoy!

The municipal campground, located next to the beach and the 26 km multi-use trail, is the ideal home base: bordered by forest and offering a multitude of activities. You'll find canoe, kayak, paddleboard, electric and regular bike rentals, outdoor board games, and even a volleyball court with a view of the magnificent Lac Quévillon.

The bike path winds through peaceful spots, dotted with lookouts, picnic areas and educational panels about local flora. Boating enthusiasts can launch their watercraft free of charge at the municipal wharf and set off on an adventure with friends or family.

Kids will love La Bougeotte Park, the water games, and the town's soccer, baseball, basketball and tennis courts. Whenever you want to enjoy golden sand and a refreshing swim, head for the municipal beach.

For food lovers, treat yourself at Quévillon Pizzeria, then wrap up this road trip with your gaze lost in the magnificent surrounding landscapes. The kind of ending that makes you want to come back.

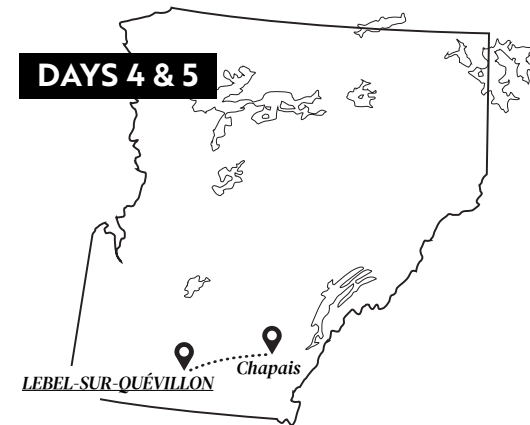
